The Role

The SEPI programme aims to foster cross community and cross-border collaborations between participants by providing a structured programme of best practice exchange, shared learning and collaboration on the tackling of environmental challenges.

The programme will be delivered to 500 schools over a 4-year period through two concurrent and complementary elements of activities.

 Core Student Programme - The core programme aims to promote dialogue and positive exchanges between young people while also facilitating the development of an entrepreneurial mindset and innovative thinking. Key activities include: Teacher and student training days, virtual courses, impact day design sprints and a cross-Island Climate Summit and awards ceremony.

2. Transformational Schools Leadership Programme – This provides opportunities for school leaders and educationalists to develop joint approaches to shared leadership issues across schools through a structured development programme.

Key activities include: Once large scale annual conference and smaller thematic or regional seminars/workshops.

SEPI is delivered jointly with Co-operation Ireland to engage with 4000 students and 900 educationalists. This project will enhance crosscommunity and cross border engagement, develop student skills and relationships, build networks for schools, facilitate positive peacebuilding and climate action initiatives and promote digital and innovative learning. This project is designed to energise the imaginations and aspirations of young people by increasing their awareness of future careers in tech, innovation, and entrepreneurship. As a Programme Co-ordinator, you will be responsible for designing and facilitating impact day design sprints to students aged 16-18 years old on a cross-border and cross community basis. You will work closely with the Youth and Ambition Programme Manager and provide support on any other activities needed to deliver the programme. The role will require a large amount of travel (claiming for fuel is permitted).

Responsibilities:

- Support in the organisation and delivery of an engaging, meaningful, and innovative programme that will promote dialogue and positive exchanges between young people on a cross border and cross community basis.
- Facilitate high energy and innovative design sprints and workshops
 within schools to upskill young people in the development of an
 entrepreneurial mindset and innovative thinking, develop key
 relationships and inspire young people with the opportunities
 available to them.

- Develop engaging workshops, exercises, and resources to support young people in climate change, peacebuilding, innovation and entrepreneurship.
- To maintain a strong working relationship with companies within the Catalyst community including tenant companies and Catalyst partners, and with stakeholders within the education sector such as teachers, school principals, Education authority representatives and others.
- Ensure feedback and impact data is collated and presented in a timely manner to appropriate audiences.
- To prepare, attend and deliver visually appealing keynote presentations to a range of audiences as required.
- Work with the finance team to successfully procure suppliers following SEUPB guidelines
- Ensure data protection and safeguarding processes are up to date and stringently adhered to
- Liaise with companies who are involved in the SEPI programme
- Work closely with the Marketing and Brand team to support the promotion of the SEPI programme
- Undertaking any other reasonable duties which fall within the remit of this role.
